

# Yarn flies- fishing lure or knitting nemesis?

Yarn flies... are they really?

OK, when I got started with this sort of fishing (long, long ago in a galaxy far away ...) I heard about these simple things and that they worked. Basically it's just the standard egg-loop tie with 2-3 pieces of fluffy yarn inserted in it and perhaps fluffed up a bit with an old toothbrush. Usually these are fished with a drop or two of scent oil (I like shrimp scent) and no bait. You can also add a drift bobber like a Corky or homemade foam one, but it's not essential.

I always felt a bit self conscious about calling them "flies " though, especially around *real* fly fishermen. They are not intended to imitate any kind of fly, or any other kind of aquatic life. They are tied like any kind of fly. Why they work, I guess you'll have to ask the fish!

That they **do work** is a simple fact.

Let me suggest a couple simple improvements. After making your egg loop and inserting some yarn, consider adding a bit of sparkle yarn, Crystal Flash (check the fly materials aisle at your favorite tackle shop ) or the tinsel you'll find in Christmas decorations. Just cut of 1 inch to 1 1/2 inches long and slip it in. Now take a short length of "conventional" yarn and pass it under the fluffy yarn and tinsel. Tie a simple overhand knot to secure all the stuff in the loop and fluff it up if necessary. Use a sharp pair of scissors to trim it, if you think it needs it.

Now you have a soft, scent-able, sparkly rig, that costs about a penny more than the hook. Rig it up with a slinky, and off you go!

But I **still** don't think they are flies...I'm gonna call them "Yarnies" from now on, OK? |Larry Palmer

#### I Additions to agenda

- 1. Approximately \$500 has been made from used gear sales most gear was donated from Camp Angelos, Leslie and Rod Brobeck; sales will continue as items are available.
- 2. On 1/10/10 there will be an on river steelhead fishing activity as a follow-up to the recent steelhead clinic. Participants are asked to arrive at Glen Otto around 7:30 AM with a hot lunch provided around noon.
- 3. Name tags will continue to be imprinted on the Oregon image shape and will sell for the cost of printing approximately \$9. In the past the chapter has been selling the tags for nearly half the mfg. cost with the chapter absorbing the difference.
  - 4. We are asked to not sell raffle tickets at FMS prior to 1/2/10.
- 5. The association is raising the cost of a trial/new membership from \$10 to \$20; there is discussion on raising the senior price.
- 6. In appreciation for all of his efforts, Bill Beith was presented a print of a Bee Hovering, which reflects his ongoing efforts commitments to the chapter; Colonel made the presentation.

#### **II Business**

- 1. Last Saturday's clinic was attended by 73 visitors resulting in nine new members. Because of their disruptions, It was decided to stop the raffles.
  - a. Larry is in the early planning stages for a spring salmon clinic.
  - 2. Jeff Kirkman & Jeff Stoeger reported approximately 30 attended the clinics at FMS.
- 3. Ray's Frostbite Follies is planned for 3/13/10 with a hot lunch at the Camp. Remember this is a very popular members only activity with a \$10 charge to cover food costs.
- 4. The December chapter dinner/auction was a success and brought in \$3500. How we can improve the function for next year was discussed: limiting the number of silent items, more Dutch items and coding the item and matching bid card. Leslie is in the process of mailing thank you notes and tax forms. Leslie received appreciation from the board for her efforts. If anyone has an idea to improve this event, please do not hesitate to contact Leslie or any board member.
  - 5. The chapter now owns a new 100 cup West Bend coffee maker.
- 6. ODFW is still discussing plans for the Cedar Creek emergency road. As plans develop and volunteers are needed, more information will be made available.
- 7. Due to Jay's accepting the position as association president, he is stepping down as our chapter president, and Jeff Stoegger will ascend to the vacated chapter presidency.

#### III Officer/director reports

- 1. For the upcoming Boat and Sportsmen's shows, volunteers are again needed contact Mike Myrick.
- 2. During the board drawing, Colonel drew the short straw so will bring cookies for the next meeting: one dozen should do it if we share.
  - 3. Currently, we have \$10,000 in savings.
  - 4. With a membership of 222 members, we are the largest chapter.
  - 5. 12/28/09 is the deadline for articles to be submitted to Larry for the newsletter.




