Another sign Winter Steelhead season is here! Broodstock Steelhead collection time



The "wild" (non-hatchery) Steelhead Broodstock program on the Sandy and other Oregon Rivers were developed with the help of Guides and ODFW. This program has become wildly successful at bringing back strong runs of in-basin fish that are considerably more like non-hatchery fish. These fish have stronger DNA, are more aggressive biters, larger on average, and return over a much broader range of the season. Most years by Christmas time one can begin to expect to see catchable Steelhead on these rivers. Both hatchery and non-hatchery fish will be in the river through the month of March. This is a unique program in place on several other Oregon rivers like the nearby Alsea, Nestucca, and Wilson Rivers. The program provides stronger hatchery return Steelhead that anglers can keep. This program is an example of programs we support in building a better fishing future.

Volunteers use hook and line to catch and collect wild adult fish with 49 Steelhead for the program on the Sandy River this year. These will be kept alive in aerated boxes. Each tank has an aerator in it and the tank will hold several Steelhead for a few hours until they can get to the drop off point that is located along the river on private property.





A Hatchery crew will pick up the wild Steelhead throughout each week and transport them from the tank to the hatchery, where the adult fish are spawned.

Unlike Salmon, Steelhead will return to the ocean and even return to their home river again following a year or two in the ocean. "Scientists believe that salmon navigate by using the earth's magnetic field like a compass. When they find the river they came from, they start using smell to find their way back to their home stream. They build their 'smell memory-bank' when they start migrating to the ocean as young fish."¹



The maxillary is a bony structure, located on the upper jaw of a fish, which is circled in red in this photo.

The 49 wild Steelhead which volunteer anglers collect will produce 90,000 Broodstock Steelhead smolts which, along with 70,000 Hatchery Steelhead. These will be planted in the Sandy River in the spring of 2024 after acclimating them in water of the Sandy River watershed. A total of 160,000 smolt to be introduced to the Sandy River. These fish will have their right maxillary clipped/removed.


