

#### Columbia River Spring Chinook season in peril

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife commission previously committed to working with Washington and assembled a bi-state work group that would develop the allocation for sport and commercial angling for spring chinook in a non-political and equitable manner. That work group developed an allocation that set the percentage of impacts at 65% for sport anglers and 35% for commercial anglers.

However, the Oregon commission then decided to back out on their commitment and arbitrarily set the allocation at 60% and 40% with the thinking that the Washington commission would meet them half way. This was done at the behest of some very entrenched power holders on the commission that refuse to understand the importance and size of the impact of sport fishing on the economy. The Washington Commission, in light of the Oregon Commission's unwillingness to abide by the agreed terms of last year's agreement, has prohibited the Director of WDFW from negotiating fisheries.



This could mean that there is the possibility that we might not see a fishing season on the Columbia river as both Washington and Oregon have to agree on the methods, length, and allocation for the season.

The lack of commitment and faith on the part of the Oregon commission is truly galling with one commission member stating that Joe's (formerly GI Joe's) could sell more tires and batteries to make up for the loss to sport fishing.

It is time for everyone to stand up and fight this poor decision making by calling, emailing, and writing your senators, representatives and the governor. Let them know that sport anglers deserve to be allocated an equitable number of fish from this fishery and that the Oregon Commission is making the state of Oregon look bad by going back on their word to support the bistate work group's recommendations.




### The steelhead are here!
