

And of course, there would be the judges and commentators. Would that be Steelhead Hall of Famers? Bill Monroe? Holders of national and international records? Would we let someone from the Great Lakes region be a judge?

Would the salmon and steelhead Olympics include catching derbies? Perhaps the triathlon would be the fly, level wind and spinning competition. How about short and long tracks for bobber dogging? Several events would have to center on cooking. Top steelhead chef! Smoked fish offs. And those obscure events that make no sense to anyone. Behind the back-knot tying. Bow rope throw. Pulling anchor. And one of my favorites, putting the plug in after the boat is launched.

SALMON QUEST 2018

Salmon Quest is a renowned event that gives sport fisherfolk an opportunity to give back to the resource -- while having a really great time. Proceeds from the tournament are used to improve sport fisheries through on-the-ground restoration projects in the Willamette and Sandy River basins. Past Quest funds were spent to greatly expand volunteer participation in stream nutrient enrichment -- returning excess hatchery salmon carcasses to their local rivers to provide food and nutrients for young salmonids and wildlife. This day-long friendly competition culminates with a banquet and award ceremony, and registration includes a day of fishing with a guide, commemorative gift, and a delicious dinner.

Smolt Have Arrived at The Acclimation Pond!

The acclimation pond in Sandy, Oregon is up and running! Volunteers are needed to help feed the smolt once a day for the next three weeks. This is a great chance to take your family up, feed the fish and record their progress.

The acclimation pond is located at the Bull Run Watershed on the Bull Run River just above where it flows into the Sandy River. It's a giant size swimming pool approx. 60 feet long by 10 feet wide and approx. 4-5 feet deep, allowing our little Chinook to swim around and get used to the smell of the Bull Run River water before being released.

Once released, they make their way down to the Sandy River, out to the Columbia River and

head toward the ocean to live for the next 3-5 years.

This acclimation period helps the smolt remember the river water they're released from. Hoping for a strong return of fish in 3-5 years when they come back as mature clipped Spring Chinook Salmon.

Jeff Fulop from ODFW said, "a normal return ratio for Chinook salmon smolt are between 1-1.5% from those released. Migration survival depends greatly on predation, enough food supply in rivers while small and in the ocean while growing as well as the harvest rate in the ocean and rivers while trying to return to spawn."

PAN FRIED SALMON WITH CREAMY SUN-DRIED TOMATO SAUCE



1 1/2 pounds (700g) salmon fillets, with or without skin
3 large garlic cloves, minced
1/2 yellow onion, minced
1 small jar (3-4 oz) sun-dried tomatoes in oil, drained and sliced (reserve 2 tablespoons oil for the recipe)
1/4 teaspoon paprika
1 cup (250ml) half and half (or mix half milk – half cream for a lighter cream)
1 tablespoon dried basil (or Italian seasoning)
1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
1/2 cup (125ml) vegetable stock (1 crumbled bouillon cube with 1/2 cup water).

DIRECTIONS

1. Lightly season salmon fillets with salt and pepper. In a large non stick pan on medium heat, sear salmon fillets in 2 tablespoons oil, 2 – 3 minutes on each side. Remove salmon from the pan and set aside.
2. In the same skillet add 2 tablespoons oil reserved from the sun-dried tomatoes jar, saute onion, garlic, sun-dried tomatoes, paprika, red chili pepper flakes and dried basil for 1 minute until garlic fragrant.
3. Add vegetable stock to deglaze the skillet and bring to a gentle simmer. Add half and half to the skillet and stir until a creamy sauce forms. Adjust seasoning with salt and pepper.
4. Add salmon back to the skillet and reheat for a few minutes. Sprinkle with fresh basil and serve over pasta, rice or bulgur. Enjoy!

Free Oregon Fishing Days for 2018: The 2018 days are scheduled for Feb. 17-18 (Presidents' Day Weekend), June 2-3, Sept. 1-2 (Sat.-Sun. of Labor Day Weekend) and Nov. 23-24 (the two days after Thanksgiving). While ODFW had originally planned to offer free fishing Dec. 31, 2017-Jan. 1, 2018, the Department has cancelled those dates to stay within the eight-day limit in 2018 and to offer free fishing during months when fishing conditions are better.
