

Spring Chinook Salmon Workshop 2016 Manual excerpts

Shrimp - Prawns

Prawn shrimp entered the fishing scene about 30 years ago. You can purchase them frozen and uncolored and apply dye made for this purpose yourself, or buy then dyed already.



Brighter colors seem best in murkier water. Prawns can be rigged on a two-hook setup similar to a herring, threaded with a long wire line threader, or attached to a prawn spinner which has a clip wire for that purpose.

Keep them in a cooler with ice...they spoil in warmer weather. You also can simply use them as an alternate to herring for **Bottom Bumping** or **Suspended Trolling**.

On the line above the prawn you can add several beads, and then a Spin-n-Glo or clevis and spinner blade for added attraction!
