

Sandy River Hatchery

This healthy wild winter steelhead full of eggs was caught and released this past weekend about 15 miles up the Sandy River. If you look closely behind her dorsal fin on her back there is a tag that was put in at Sandy Hatchery last January 19th after she was caught and donated by anglers from the lower river.

She was held at the hatchery until March 19th when she was mature enough to spawn. That day we live spawned her by expressing her eggs out with air and then released her unharmed back down onto the lower Sandy River where she migrated back downstream to the Columbia and then back out to the ocean. She obviously survived out there for another year and matured again enough to make the journey back upstream to the Sandy again this winter. Her genetic aggressiveness showed again as she was caught by another angler and this is exactly the kind of traits we are trying to keep integrated into our hatchery production by spawning wild fish with our hatchery fish each year.

This story proves that the extreme care and handling of these precious wild fish from the minute they are landed by fishermen, placed in a live box, picked up by ODFW, transported to the hatchery, held for months until mature, live spawned, and then released back into the river still gives these fish a chance to come back heathy the next year. This is one of the many reasons I love my job.

Ocean Salmon Management Coded Wire Tag Look-Up

Thank you for providing your coded wire tagged snout to our sampling staff this past season. Coded wire tags are one of the most important fishery management tools available to help insure that our salmon resources are harvested in a responsible manner.

The Coho salmon you caught in Astoria on Sunday, June 23, 2019 had the tag code number of 637188. The fish was 3 years old and was part of a release of 1,119,174 Coho into the COWLITZ RIVER from COWLITZ SALMON HATCHERY on Tuesday, May 1, 2018. The COWLITZ RIVER is found within the COLUMBIA R., WA area.
