

I. GENERAL

(Board Meeting Minutes con't.)

Snap one snap on your ready to go K-fish/Flatfish type lure that is ready to go.

Snap a 2 oz. sinker into the snap swivel on the end of your "Rod line" and cast it out below the boat. Once it is on the rivers' bottom, take the free snap on the end of your leader line and snap it *over* the line running out from your rod. Carefully let the K-Fish down into the water. The current will pull it out and slide it right down to those two beads on your line. You are fishin' now!

Hey, before you let it out did you do these things?

Sharpen the hooks

Check to make sure the plug ran true with the wrap on it

Apply extra scent

I let the plugs work for 30 minutes, bring them in and check for grass, hit them with extra scent and put them back out. After an hour, I put on fresh wraps.

We had a total of 4 "sniffs" at our lures. Two were quick taps that did not continue. Two kept at it. We let them taste until they pulled the rod down hard and began to pull off line. Them I picked up the rod and set the hook. Striking too early usually means a lost fish.

I think this simple method has a lot in common with plunking that is often an underrated method. They share a common feature in carefully observing the current and fish traveling lanes, and stealthily putting your rig right in those lanes.

It may be simple, but it works!

Cookie List



The Sandy Chapter is fortunate to have numerous guides as members. While these guides are very generous in donating trips for our auction and other events, they also donate time for clinics and gear for various activities. Additionally, discounts to members are usually given. How many have taken advantage of the 4x4x4 trips in the fall/early winter?

I have become acquainted with several of our member guides and count many successful trips with them, yet while sitting in a boat recently - probably barely awake - something occurred to me: we tip our food servers 10-20% for taking our order, bringing our food and checking with us occasionally, but do we tip our guides? Yes, there are days when the catching is not that great, but consider the time/effort put in by the guide, and this is for up to eight hours. However, their work day begins hours before launching and does not end when returning home.

Please keep in mind how hard your guide works for you and say thank you with a generous trip.

A Simple method

Recently I went fishing with Joe Blum in his 15' Smokercraft boat. These boats are great little fishing machines for 2-3 guys, easy to launch and tow, and affordable as boats go. Apparently, some fish don't care how fancy your boat is as long as a nice lure is placed in front of them. We caught two salmon, and I'll tell you how we did it.

The river was high and muddy, and the Columbia was closed so we went down into the Multnomah Channel and as the tide was high at 10 AM and outgoing for the next 6 hours, simply elected to anchor and put wrapped Kwikfish out behind the boat. But where to put them out?


Most spring Chinook are caught between 8 and 20 feet of water. Sure, you'll sometimes find exceptions, but even if you are trolling over 60 feet of depth its common to fish only part way down. Using Joe's depth finder, we looked for a spot near shore where the fast high water current was slowed by friction from the shoreline. After looking at a couple spots (one was 22 feet, the other was only 7 feet...) we found a nice place to anchor in 11 feet. The current was very slow as the tide had just turned to head out, but both K-Fish would swim a bit. I knew they'd work great as the current built up. Here's a tip - if you find yourself in such a place, and the current is still a bit light you can always start out with a Spin-n-Glo. Those babies work in only a breath of current.

The muddy water suggested a bright lure, so I wrapped a fluorescent red with black dot K-14 and K-15 with Sardine wraps and applied additional ProCure sardine scent. I knew that seeing the lure would be a close-up deal, but with a salmons nose they could follow the scent trail right to them.

The way I rig these is simple. First of all let's start with the sinker line. 24-30 inches of 12# with a snap swivel on the bottom end. At the top tie in a barrel swivel. Next the mainline...take the line from your rod and slide on two large round beads, then tie it into the sinker lines' barrel swivels opposite end. The "Rod line" is now ready to go. OK, now for the leader line. Take 4-5 feet of 20-30# test and tie a round bend snap (like those that come with the K-Fish) and tie one on each end (Con't on Page 5)
