

- 1. Remove your sunglasses.

- 4. Clean the blood off the fish.
- 5. Rotate the fish to make it shine in the camera
- 6. Smile, you just caught a fish.
- 7. Portrait pictures work better on the cover of Steelheader




How to be Published in the Newsletter

Check Twice for Motorcycles

It is unfortunate for those of us who ride, we are injured or worse because many people do not look twice for motorcycles. Not knowing what is going on around you while driving can injure others.

During good weather particularly, double check clearances when changing lanes, and if a motorcycle is behind you slow gradually, do not anchor the brakes. Remember cycles cannot stop as fast as a car or truck, and cutting in fornt of them, then abruptly braking is extremely dangerous for the person on the bike.

Unfortunately, this is what happened to me a couple weeks ago. The person had to be in the right lane and at the last minute cut me off and jammed on the brakes. I was able to slow to about 35 mph instead of 55 but still hit the person catipulting me through the air. I have 2 broken ribs, badly bruised heart and a concussion all because someone was not paying attention.





Saturday May 9th, 2015 - 9 AM - 5:30 PM Summer Steelhead


All clinics will be held at our regular meeting place, the Sam Cox Building in Glenn Otto Park.



COASTAL MULTISPECIES PLAN APPROVED BY COMMISSION

In last month's newsletter we summarized what the Oregon Coastal Multispecies Conservation & Management Plan is and why it was initiated. On Friday, June 6th, the Oregon Fish & Wildlife Commission voted unanimously to pass the proposal submitted to them by the ODFW.

You may visit their website at: http://www.dfw.state.or.us/fish/CRP/coastal_multispecies.asp to review the documents submitted to support this plan. In broad strokes, this plan will guide hatchery practices and wild emphasis areas for anadramous salmonids on the Oregon coast from Cape Blanco to Seaside for the next 12 years. Sev-

eral life cycles are needed before program assessment can be initiated.

It is necessary to have hatchery plans in effect and adhered to in order to minimize chances for litigation. This program should (but most likely won't) comfort both consumptive fishers and wild fish proponents; because it manages 50 basins overall, 25 for hatchery production and harvest, and 25 for wild fish emphasis and non-retention. HGMP's (Hatchery Genetic Management Plans) will now be constructed to comply with the CMP.

This is a unique plan, and Oregon has a unique salmonid resource on the coast. We have several healthy runs of wild fish which will be maintained. And we have several basins where hatchery stock is comingled with wild stock,

and these basins will continue to provide consumptive angling opportunities. No other coastal state can boast such robust wild stocks and none other have such a plan in place.

Numerous stakeholders on both sides of the wild/hatchery debate gave valuable input throughout this process, and their concerns were respected and helped inform the final Plan. Because the Plan lays out a path that protects both harvest and non retention, we need to be diligent from this point on to assure compliance is enforced in order to protect both side's interests.
