If I forget something Howard is usually right on it making sure it gets done. Right now he is working on all the preparations for the different fishing camps that are coming up at Camp Angelos. July 2009 Association News #1

HB 3013 - Marine Reserves; applies important public oversight and evaluation processes to this new program; directs ODFW to develop a work plan for two relatively small reserves.

HB 3089 - Poaching; one of the key bills aimed at the more serious fish and wildlife crimes, and giving the state additional tools; the bill increases penalties, fines and restitution.

HB 3489 - Hatchery Reform; requires study of hatchery pathogens and targets such thing s as production management and improved maintenance for coastal facilities.

It should be noted that salmon production and fishing issues have received a new level of attention in the State House this year and we must keep working to keep these important issues high on the political radar. It is clear that in the future the angling public must do much more to educate and motivate state politicians. Increasing the number of state legislators who place a high priority on our key issues should be job number one during upcoming campaign seasons. The 2009 Oregon Legislature is now in the home stretch even though only a small part of its work has been completed. Nonetheless, the session is expected to terminate before the upcoming 4th of July weekend. So it should come as no surprise that ANWS is still involved with a number of important bills that are awaiting a final floor votes. With a little luck and attention the bills listed below should soon be enacted into law:

Willamette Trip- a big splash !

We had a pleasant camping trip. Fair weather, and the river to ourselves. We caught some trout, and had a scare. Future programs on water safety and equipment will expand on what we learned, but the essential lesson was-<u>Your PFD can only work for you if you have it on!</u>

Saturday afternoon about 2:00 as our party of boats left the McKenzie and entered the Willamette a sudden gust of wind caused Mike Myricks' canoe to duck under a tree branch and some brush causing a loss of control. In moments his boat tossed him into the cold water which was moving 4-5 miles an hour. It could have happened to anyone. Fortunately Mike was smart enough to have his PFD on.

I had just entered the Willamette followed by Jay Burris. I looked upstream into the McKenzie expecting to see Mikes orange canoe coming down....but what I saw was a floating food cooler– never a good sign.

I immediately rowed ashore and Art Israealson and Jay Burris went back upstream on foot to find him while I called 911. Art and Jay found him a few minutes later. By then I had two Lane County Marine Patrol boats headed our way. We knew they were on the river– they had inspected us about 45 minutes before! They arrived in about 15 minutes and got Mike (*and his canoe!*) back up to the launch site, where Mike secured the canoe to his vehicle. Then undeterred, he came back to finish the trip in Jays drift boat! Most people would have given up after being tossed in the river, but not Mike. As the saying goes "it's not the size of dog in the fight-it's the size of fight in the dog".
