Enjoy a relaxing float down the lower section of the Sandy River while picking up trash to make it a more beautiful place for fish and wildlife who live there. Volunteers of all skill levels over the age of ten, accompanied by an adult, are welcome. Wear appropriate clothing to get wet (avoid cotton) and footwear for walking along rocky beaches, and bring a water bottle.

We will meet at Lewis and Clark State Recreation Area, and leave cars to shuttle to our launch point at Dabney State



Park. If you have your own craft (including inner tubes), please bring a paddle and life vest to go with it.

OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS

Dorms are available at the Tillamook Fairgrounds at a heavily discounted rate. You would be responsible for providing all of your own bedding, towels, and toiletries. Parking, electrical hook-up, and water is also available for RVs, boats, and other vehicles. Please see below for the fee schedule.

COST

Fees only cover actual costs of renting the dorm/RV spots and purchasing food. Attendees are expected to cover other costs including pitching in to cover gas, ramp fee, and bait on boats. - Per individual staying at fairground (dorm or RV), \$75.

- Per additional family member(s) staying at fairgrounds, \$65.

- Per individual/family member(s) not staying at fairground but participating in evening meals and activities (not including breakfast), \$40.

- RV sites with 20 or 50 amp available for an additional \$15/night.
People providing seats on their boats are offered a \$20 discount on their total fees as an incentive to bring boats

Some ODFW tips for improving survival of released salmon/steelhead

- If you seem to be encountering a large number of unmarked fish and few clipped fish, try moving to a different fishing location.
- Check for a fin clip before using a landing net. If you aren't certain, try to check again while the fish is in the net, but before taking it out of the water.
- Avoid using more than one hook on line. Double hook mooching rigs can make releasing a salmon difficult, and the second hook often ends up creating additional damage to the fish.
- Use a de-hooking tool to release fish without removing them from the water while the line is being held down in the opposite hand.



- If the hook is deep inside the mouth or throat, cut the line close to the mouth.
- If you inadvertently net a fish that must be released, try to get the fish back in the water immediately with as little handling as possible.




