NW Steelheader Tillamook Fish-Along, Weekend of Oct. 8, 2011

Show up Friday evening for dinner and a fishing report and fishing clinic. There will be breakfast Saturday and Sunday morning and a "build your own" lunch bar with lunch meat selections for sandwiches, fruit, a snack, and a beverage. With breakfast in your belly and a lunch bag in your hand, you are ready to head out with your fishing buddies. There will be a BBQ dinner Saturday night followed winners will also be announced. Sunday morning starts with another hot breakfast and lunch bar.

Everyone will need to pack out before leaving for fishing Sunday morning. (The dorm will be cleaned and locked up when everyone leaves. The gate will be left unlocked until late afternoon for the RVs.) Boat captains are able to pick their own passengers, but we will help coordinate other boaters and riders to balance local knowledge and expertise to insure this is a learning experience for everyone who needs it as well as being a great weekend of fishing. This will be done well in advance to allow participants to coordinate their fishing. Participants will be responsible for boat fuel, bait etc. (which is only a small portion of the captains costs.)

We are going to have a

tournament that will win half the total tournament entry purse for three participants. Enter the tournament for \$20 and have a chance to win a percentage of the total pot. Entrants will also get a donation receipt for \$10 of the entry fee. 30% of all entry fees go to the angler with the largest fish by weight after gutting and gilling. (This allows anglers to take good care of their catch for optimum food quality.) 10% to the second largest fish. 10% to the smallest salmon by length (smallest being the closest to but not under the minimum legal harvest adult size). Entries must be at the Tillamook Fairground Dorm weigh-in no later than 5:00pm. Please include the entry fee with your registration fee, but we will accept entries up to 8:30 on Friday 10/7/11 at the fair ground dorm.

Location

The Tillamook Fairground Dorm is an ideal location for this event. It is located between the most popular Tillamook Bay boat ramps and is between the Wilson and Trask Rivers. There are also bank fishing opportunities just as close. There is water and 15 amp electrical service for RVs and plenty of parking for boats and other vehicles.

The dorm has a large kitchen and dining/meeting room on the main floor and two bunk rooms with bathroom & showers up stairs. Bring your sleeping bag, towel, and other shower supplies. A hot shower really feels good after a day on the bay! (Ear plugs can be helpful if there are attendees that snore.)

The Sandy Chapter of the Northwest Steelheaders, who enjoy holding their meetings, auctions and events at the Cox Building, 'stepped up to the plate' by volunteering to help with the long needed remodel bringing the kitchen up to code.

The project began with the demolition team removing the walls in the two kitchen rooms, back to the studs. What a team!!

Next the hammers and saws were put to work as material was prepared and the studs were put in place. The suggestions and expertise of our members was readily accepted by Troutdale Building Officials.

The sheetrock was finally hung in the enlarged workable kitchen and the NWSH volunteers put away their tools and once more turned their thoughts to fishing. The teamwork, while working on the kitchen project, was an example of the camaraderie enjoyed by Sandy Chapter members. Not all volunteers have the same skills but all were willing to share their skills and knowledge with others while putting many hours of work, into the project.

Buoy 10 or is it Zooy 10?

I had the opportunity to fish this year down at buoy 10. If you haven't fished buoy 10 fishery and you wonder why they call it Zooy 10 here is the reason why. I fished with Norm Ritchi one sunday morning and we left the docks around 6 am. There were more boats that you could shake a stick at. In the first stretch I counted almost 150 boats and that was in the fog. As the sun came out and burned the fog off the river, it was like bumper boats, there must have been some where around 1000 boats. It was boats as far as the eye could see. Everyone was trolling all in the same direction and if you didn't there was a very good chance that you would run into some one. Norm had using spinners on four rods and one rod with plug cut herring. The rods that seem to catch most of the fish were the two out side rods. I believe they caught most of the fish because they were closer to the bottom of the river. The outside rods had 16 ounce lead and the inside rods had 12 ounces. The spinners were size 6 blades with green and orange tips. We had 12 take downs with 3 wilds released and we had 2 break off with 5 keepers chinook and 1 hatchery Coho. To say it wasn't fun would be a lie, and to say that there was solitude would be a big lie. The best part was that you had the chance to conquer and take your bounty and we did.

I then went back down to buoy 10 two weeks later with Dean Pierce just before they close the chinook fishery. We hooked 12 fish the first day and had three nice chinook with one weighing 33 lbs. The very next day at the same spot the day before we landed another 30 lbs plus chinook and we then landed a very nice 13 lbs hatchery Coho. We hooked another dozen or so fish before we called it day. The best part was, being able to fish with friends and having a great time. So if you ever get the chance and some one offers you a chance to fish this fishery, jump on it. You will have the time of your life. The fishing action turns on and off like a light switch. One minute its hot and then you wait a while and the light switch will go off again. So get out there and some fishing. I hope that you can see the photo of couple of the fish that were caught.
