One Last Cast

Jim Cathcart (aka Navigator)

I read The *Compleat Angler* by Izaak Walton (and Charles Cotton) over the summer (the 2004 Modern Library Paperback Edition with an Introduction by Howell Raines). My mom sent it to me thinking I would enjoy it. I did. If you have never heard of Izaak Walton or this book – then you are watching too much Outdoor GPS. In a nutshell – the book was written in the mid-17th century and if you are of northern European descent (like I am) – captures eloquently our roots as Piscatorus. What is mind boggling about this book is that it could have been published by Frank Amato publications this century. It is completely nerdy about fish and fishing.

The book also completely ignores the realities of the time. And those realities in the 17th century was that the planet was going through the Little Ice Age, farming was still primarily subsistence and when the climate made



growing food difficult, people starved. Glaciers were advancing and those countries with warmer climates spread their empires. European settlement of North American stuck with the founding of Jamestown. In Central Europe, the Thirty Years War between Protestants and Catholics raged. Yet Walton extolled the virtues of pursing trout and grayling with worm, minnow and fly (both real and artificial) and to say that Walton's level of detail given to each was meticulous would be an understatement. Same goes for Cotton on describing the seasonality of fly patterns.

In fact, fishing was promoted as the noblest of pursuits to escape the realities of the time. So much better than hunting or falconry. (Spoiler alert – both parts of the book – the first written by Walton and the second written by his adopted son Cotton – center on teaching the virtues of fishing to a hunter, met by chance on a country road.) Besides the expected references to trout, grayling and salmon, over a dozen other

species worthy of pursuit with the angle are described. The proper keeping of bait is well detailed as is the caring and cooking of the catch. Wait for it, the book details the 17th century equivalent of fishing with bobber and bait. Even more remarkable, the book is a compilation of previous works published in the 16th century and earlier. To be clear, Walton and Cotton's writings are not about fishing for subsistence, but fishing for recreation. We can be comforted that piscators are held in high esteem – much more so that those caught up pursuing profit or who spend their time lawyering over disputes.

Now having read the book I am convinced that fishing is innate within us. It is a heritage that manifests itself and transcends the various cultures that make us up as species. Whether through storytelling, fable, mythology, song, dance, poetry or the written word, fishing as a recreational pursuit, as a noble escape, has been with us since before the dawn of civilization.



Success in Tillamook

On Sunday the 23rd , I decided to try a trip on Tillamook Bay. The tide turned early in the morning, about 6:30, so I left my home in St. John's early and aimed to put in about 7 AM. The drive was uneventful. I recently had purchased a new Toyota pickup which has a lot more power than my old truck, and this was a pleasant sensation of money well spent. I had invited my friend Tom Heaslet to go with me.



Arriving in Garibaldi nicely and on time, we got the boat ready for launch as dawn broke and we were pleased to find plenty of parking left for us. Launching only took a few minutes, and we soon we putting out of the moorage to get started. My friend Tom has done a lot of fishing on the ocean, but nothing exactly like this, so I coached him a bit " you want to fish close to the bottom without dragging on it. The depth changes, so hold your rod and feed out line or bring in line as the depth requires. I will watch the depth finder and let you know. ". We simply trolled out of the moorage, turned right, starting to fish right by the first docks. We trolled plug cut herring with no flashers. Sometimes I use a flasher, but if there is a lot of grass in the water, they can really wind up in a mess, and I find the simple straight herring deal easier to keep clean.

It was foggy of and on for the first couple of hours as we made passes from our starting point down to navigation marker #11, near Crab Harbor.

About 10 AM, I was giving my arm a little rest, and had put the rod in a rod holder. A chinook took the herring and basically hooked itself-sweet deal! After a relatively standard first couple of runs, it seemingly made an impressive run of about 250 feet. But it wasn't the salmon that responsible...*my fish had been grabbed by a determined sea lion!* We circled over to get close, but the sea lion was unwilling to let loose. A passing boat told us to splash the water with the landing net, which we did without effect. As my friend Tom tried to maneuver the boat close to the sea lion. I kept the rod in one hand and tossed a couple sinkers at the sea lion with the other. One sinker got close enough to cause him to drop the fish about 30 feet from the boat, but he instantly circled around and picked it up again about 10 feet from the boat. Back to the circle and try to scare drill....At the cost of a couple more 8 ounce sinkers, one got close enough to graze an ear and he let go of the now nearly bled out fish and we put in the net moments later. A nice bright hen, luckily ours after a determined fight .

This morning I filleted the fish and put it in brine for smoking. This afternoon I'm going looking for some nice chicken egg sized rocks for my boat. 8 ounce sinkers are expensive! Thanks. Larry Palmer
