



Alaska is about to allow one of its largest drainage areas in the Bristol Bay area to open up to pebble mining. This is one of the last natural and unspoiled areas for up river fish to spawn. Everyone who fishes needs to get involved. Russell will share his information on what we can do and why we should get involved. This will affect everyone who fishes or wishes to fish in the future. The impact from this pebble mining will have an effect on today's fishing as well as future fishing. The pebble mining project will wipe out miles of spawning ground for all salmon and trout species. I hope that you will come to learn more about this and will consider aiding in the effort to put a stop to the pebble mining in Alaska.

The chapter donated half the money from the fishing derby to the Association and the other half went out as prize money for the top three fish that were caught. Norm took top prize for the biggest fish and Mel Stanislawski took second place. Thanks to all the members who participated in the derby and those who joined us for the fish along.

On a beautiful Saturday morning, September 24 we held our semi-annual Glenn Otto Park, Sandy River Clean-up.

In summary, sixteen volunteers accumulated forty-two SOLV bags of trash almost filling up the dumpster at Glenn Otto Park. Trash of all sorts.

Most disappointing were reports from some volunteers stating that they were amazed by the volume of adult and infant diapers left along the east bank of the Sandy River and some along the river bank in Glenn Otto park. The prize to a couple of volunteers was some full bottles and cans of expensive ale and beer.

Russ Sumida was that last volunteer to report in. On his second trip back to east of the river he brought back four full SOLV bags of trash, an oar and a large rubber inter tube.

I know how hard it is for members to break away from other plans, especially on a nice day to volunteer to pick up trash. It is more difficult for our more senior members with health issues but they persevered.

October 11, chapter members Steven Childress, Larry Beaver, John Hydorn and Colonel Thomas set out for the Siletz River to spend a day salmon fishing with guide/chapter member Jack Glass. With cooperative weather conditions, except when rain came in a deluge, this intrepid group of anglers was highly successful, if four limits of salmon are considered a success. Each angler tagged a coho and salmon although one angler's rod went unchallenged while he accepted handoffs from Steve and Larry. Larry's gift was especially appreciated as it turned out to be a 20ish pound chinook.

With one more tag to fill, the group ended the day trolling herring - the coho were all hooked on spinners - until Larry's rod bucked under the weight of a 24 pound chinook. While fighting this fish, the skies opened to a rainfall so hard it made seeing difficult. Five coho and four chinook were placed in the fish box and filleted by Jack at the end of the fishing day.

All participants agreed this was an exceptional fishing day, and the catching was gravy. Jack mentioned that he had some openings so if anyone is interested in fishing the Siletz contact him at 503-260-2315. Jack said this Siletz fishery will hold up through early November.


