Steelheaders Support Angler Education Jim Cathcart , Angler Education Director

On Saturday, September 14th, members of Sandy River Chapter supported the City of Fairview's Youth Fishing event held at Fairview's East and West Salish Ponds in partnership with the Oregon Department of Fish and Wilidlife (ODFW). Chapter members Jeff Boughton, Terri Boughton, Jim Cathcart, Gerard Mangan, Bob Pierce and Steve Rothenbucher were on hand to teach the basics of fishing to youth seeking to catch a fish; with the majority of these volunteers being trained certified angling instructors through ODFW's Outdoor Skills program. Salmon and Trout Enhancement Program (STEP)



biologist Jonathan Cox was also there with ODFW's Angler Education trailer.

The trailer provides rods and reels, tackle, and bait to participating anglers. Chapter support of the event was necessary so the City of Fairview could meet the requirements for receiving an Educational Fishing Permit for the event. The permit allows youth over the age of 14 to fish for free. The chapter volunteers tended stations teaching the Basics of Fishing (rods, reels, tackle and knots) and Aquatic Education (fish identification and identifying where fish habitat). City of Fairview staff and volunteers tended stations on Water Safety and Stewardship & Ethics.

"The goal of introducing youth to local open spaces and teaching them how to fish was achieved. We had 24 participants with 2 kids catching their first fish", said event organizer Eric Rutledge, City of

Fairview. Actually, 3 youth caught their first fish as a late catch was reported at the end of the event. Though the fish were small bluegills (the ponds could not be stocked with trout due to warm water temperatures), the glee, giggles and screams of hearing the sound of that first fish is still priceless. ODFW handed out certificates to all those who caught their first fish ever.

In memoriam: Speaking of human cornerstones who dealt with life's challenges, Art Israelson died at home last Sunday.

Israelson was resolute in his uncompromising love of fishing, education and conservation, and tireless in his advocacy.

A nearly lifelong member of both the Association of Northwest Steelheaders and the Oregon Bass and Panfish Club, his was a familiar sight at banquets, events and the Pacific Northwest Sportsmen's Show, where he peddled raffle tickets, shook hands with strangers and sold his brand of camaraderie and optimism.

This despite bad legs, heart and a lifetime worn thin by mountain rescues and challenges to the Legislature and state managers to make fishing worthwhile, and keep Oregon's rivers accessible to all.

His widow, Kathryn (herself a cornerstone of his support), said the family will host a "casual" memorial at Glenn Otto Park, time TBA.

Fall Bank Fish-Alongs Bring Anglers Together Jim Cathcart, Angler Education Director



As part of our continuous learning system for introducing people to the wonders and joy of fishing for salmon and steelhead, the Chapter hosted two fall Bank Fish-Along events targeting Coho salmon - Saturday, September 21st and Saturday, October 5th. What? Did I say wonders and joy? It may be more accurate to say the agonies and persistence. The Bank Fish-Alongs are structured as opportunities for Association members and prospective members to get to know one another, get introduced to some prime public access points on the Sandy River and fish in a

learning environment - where more experienced Chapter members can share tips, demonstrate techniques and answer questions to those new to the sport.

I made the commitment to the monthly Bank Fish-Alongs in recognition that the main reason people come to the Chapter is to have the opportunity to fish. So, these outings are key to member retention. Access to fishing is not a given - it can be quite intimidating on a lot of different levels. The Bank Fish-Alongs are structured to break down these barriers. They begin with an optional "no host" breakfast to provide a social aspect to the outing - people sharing a meal and getting to know one another. But, for those that want to skip the breakfast, each Fish-Along has a designated meeting time and location that is set usually the day before the event so as to take advantage of the latest information on weather, river conditions and runs. Sign-ups average about 10 anglers - a portion are individuals thinking of joining the Association (and often do afterwards). Of course, it is called a Fish-Along for a reason But, catching has happened. Both outings were on the lower river (Dabney and Glenn Otto) and were treated to fall colors, good river conditions and nice, calm crisp mornings. Keep an eye out for the winter steelhead outings to run monthly from January through April.
